

STRUCTURE OF DVD

STRUCTURE OF CD



TITLE

The images or music of a DVD are divided into some units, among which title is the biggest one.

When playing a DVD, the movie is the title.

When playing a CD, the combined tracks make up the title.

ABOUT DISCS

CHAPTER

It is smaller than title among the units of a DVD. A title is made up of several chapters, and each chapter has a number for search. But some discs may not have numbered chapters.

TRACK

In a CD, each track has a number to enable search functions.

SCENE

The menu pictures, motion and motionless pictures of a CD can be divided into some parts, these parts are scenes. Each scene has a number for search.

REGION MANAGEMENT INFORMATION

This unit is designed and manufactured to respond to the Region Management information that is recorded on a DVD disc. The region number of this player is "2". If the region number described on the DVD discs does not correspond to the Region number of this player, the player will not play this disc. This player will play DVD discs made for "ALL" regions. Therefore, this player will play DVD discs marked with labels containing the region number "2" or "ALL".

BEFORE OPERATION

SECURITY

- Before operation, check if the voltage of the unit is in line with the local voltage.
- Hold the plug to disconnect it from the mains outlet. Do not pull the power cord.
- When the plug of the unit is connected to the mains outlet, the unit will be still connected to AC even if the power is turned off.
- Disconnect the plug as soon as liquid or objects enter the unit. The unit can not be used until being checked by experts.
- Do not open the cabinet as laser rays employed by the unit may damage eyes. Any servicing should be done by qualified service personnel.

PLACEMENT

- Put the unit where ventilation is good enough to prevent overheating.
- Never put the unit in direct sunlight or near heat sources.
- Put the unit horizontally, never put any heavy object on the unit.
- To protect the pickup, do not put the unit where there is dust. If there is dust on the pickup, use a cleaning disc to clean it. Paying particular attention to the operating instructions of the cleaning disc.

CONDENSATION

Moisture will appear on the pickup lens in the following cases:

- The unit is suddenly moved from a cold place to a warm place.
- The unit is put in a room with a heater, or in cold air from an air-conditioner.
- Using the unit in a humid place. In these cases, the unit can not work. Unload the
 disc and leave the unit on for about one hour to evaporate the moisture.

CLEANING

 Use a soft cloth with a little neutral detergent to wipe the cabinet, panel and controls.

Never use abrasive paper, polishing powder, solvent like alcohol or gasoline.

HANDLING DISC

- To keep the disc clean, do not touch the playsides of the disc.
- Do not attach paper or tape to the disc.
- Keep the disc away from direct sunlight or heat sources.
- Store the disc in a disc case after playback.


CLEANING DISC

- Before playback, wipe the disc outward from the centre with clean cloth.
- Do not use any type of solvent such as thinner, benzine, commercially available cleaners or antistatic spray.

BEFORE OPERATION

CHECK ACCESSORIES

Check if you have all the accessories after the carton is opened.



USE REMOTE CONTROL

- 1 Open the battery compartment.
- 2 Insert two AAA batteries, make sure to match "+" and "-" of the batteries to the marks in the battery compartment.
- 3 Close the battery compartment.
- 4 Point the remote control at the remote sensor.





Note:

- 1. Batteries can last for about 6 months generally. Change the batteries if that does not work.
- 2. If the remote control is not used for a long time, remove the batteries to prevent battery leakage.

FRONT PANEL



① STANDBY/ON button

To switch the unit On or Off when connected to AC power outlet

② OPEN/CLOSE button

To open or close the disc tray.

3 PLAY button

To play the loaded disc. Press this button to go to the preferred item when the menu is displayed on the TV screen.

- 4 STOP
- ⑤ PREV button

To skip back from the current chapter or track.

6 NEXT button

To skip forward to the next chapter or track.



REAR PANEL



1 S-VIDEO OUTPUT

Connects to TV or monitor equipped with S-VIDEO input. In order to achieve a sharper and cleaner picture than when connected via VIDEO OUT (composite video).

2 VIDEO OUT

Connects composite video signal to input AV or PHONO sockets of TV or monitor to achieve high fidelity colour reproduction.

3 AUDIO OUT (L/R TRACK)

Two phono sockets for analogue 2 Channel audio in order to a TV or stereo amplifier.

4 HDMI

Audio/Video High definition multimedia digital output terminal.

5 DIGITAL AUDIO COAXIAL OUT

Connects digital audio under play mode into an AV amplifier or a receiver equipped with digital audio decoder for you to enjoy the theatre-quality sound in your home.

6 DIGITAL AUDIO OPTICAL OUT

Connects digital audio under play mode into an AV amplifier or a receiver equipped with digital audio decoder for you to enjoy the theatre-quality sound in your home.





* After setting the mode by using SETUP menu (for example, NTSC select in NTSC/PAL/AUTO setup), the setting is kept though you switch the unit off and turn it on.




CONNECTIONS

Turn off all equipment before operation.

The unit has many kinds of output modes like A/V output, S-VIDEO output and digital signal output (COAXIAL, OPTICAL). You may select as you need.

CONNECTED TO A TV AND AN AUDIO AMPLIFIER



Connects either ①, ②, ③+ \triangle , ④+ \triangle , ③+ \bigcirc , ④+ \bigcirc , ③+ \bigcirc , ④+ \bigcirc , ③+ \bigcirc , 0+ \bigcirc , ①+ \bigcirc .

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PLAY DISCS

Press "POWER" button on the TV and audio system, Press "TV/VIDEO" button on the TV, select VIDEO mode (TV).


Select S-Video mode if using an S-VIDEO connection.




The Step2 can be cancelled if you do not connect it to the amplifier.

Select the correct audio input on the amplifier.





Press "STAND BY/ON" button on the front panel or "to" button on the remote control to turn the unit on.



- When playing a DVD, DVD menus and titles are displayed on TV
 screen
- In the case of CD, the disc plays in order of its track number.



Press **\Delta** to remove the disc.

SYSTEM SETTING

According to the system of the TV to be connected, set the system of the unit to make it match the TV.

In STOP mode, press SYSTEM button on the remote control, then choose TV TYPE.

 When you press the [SYSTEM] button, the TV screen shows the information as: "Press [SYSTEM] button again." Press the [SYSTEM] button again, the video out system changes as follows.





V-MODE (WHEN SELECTING CVBS/RGB/HDMI)

 In case of connecting the component, press the V-MODE on the remote control to select CVBS / RGB / HDMI. In case of selecting HDMI, S-VIDEO signal is not output.

When you press the [V-MODE] button, the TV screen shows the information as: "Press [V-MODE] button again." Press the [V-MODE] button again to change the video mode.





When you connect the Composite, picture is not displayed, press the V-MODE on the remote control to select Composite video.

USB/DISC

Choose one between USB and disc (You can select one only that is inserted in).

- After inserting USB, press USB/CARD button on the remote control to select one between USB and disc.
- When you press USB/CARD button, the TV screen shows : DISC and USB






Press the "DISPLAY" button when playing a disc, the TV screen shows the information as :

FAST PLAY

When playing disc, you may play it forward fast or reverse it fast to find what you need.

Note:

Press PLAY to play normally when playing fast.

Press **>>** to play forward fast. Each time you press the button, the speed of picture changes like the right sides.

SLOW PLAY

Note:

Enjoy slow motions by the following steps. Press "SLOW" button to play slowly.

Press PLAY to play normally .

Press PLAY to play normally .

PAUSE/ STEP

Press PAUSE II on the remote control to make the playback pause. Pressing STEP **II** again moves the picture forward frame by frame.

SELECT AUDIO LANGUAGE

You can choose the language according to your choice when playing multi-language DVD.

Press "AUDIO" button, select different languages.



Note:

- 1. Different disc has different languages
- 2. You can press "AUDIO" button to choose the language you want when you play multi-language DVD discs.
- *Attention:

Please select the AUDIO language in SETUP menu to keep the setting!

SELECT CHANNELS (VCD only)

You may select the right channel or left channel or stereo from a multi-channel. Press "CHANNEL" button, the screen show alternately and select the desired audio channel:



Note:

You can use channel function when you play the disc, you can choose mono audio output (left or right channel), stereo or mix-mono

SELECT 3D AUDIO

This function outputs 3D effects on the stereo audio analog output where 3D effects are broken down.

Press [3D] button.

Every time you press [3D] button, the 3D sound toggles between 3D on -> 3D off.



MICROPHONE CONTROL

MICROPHONE SET UP

- Turn on Microphone Switch.
- Connect the Microphone to the input socket on the front panel.



- Insert the Karaoke disc (label side uppermost) and select track to play.
- Adjust the microphone level & echo on the front panel of DVD.



- Select either the Left, Right, Mixed or Stereo mode, using channel button on the remote control.
- Adjust to a comfortable volume using the volume (+/-) button on the remote control of the DVD player and the volume on the Monitor/TV.

TO SKIP SCENES IN A DISC

- Press ▶►I to move to the next chapter (or track).

 The current chapter (or track) moves to the next chapter (or track).
- Press I to move to previous chapter (or track).
 The current chapter (or track) moves to the previous chapter (or track) or first scene of current chapter (or track).

DIRECTLY MOVING TO A DESIRED TITLE (DVD/VCD)

Some movie discs may contain multiple titles. If the disc has a movie title menu recorded on it, the [TITLE/PBC] button can be used to select the movie title. Details of operation may differ depending on the disc used.

Press the [TITLE/PBC] or [MENU] button.

A list of the titles on the disc is displayed.

If using some disc, the menu screen will appear only when the disc has PBC function and PBC ON is activated.



- * In the case of PBC play, press RETURN to return to the sub-menu, press it again to return to the home menu.
- Press the [PLAY] button after pressing the [◀►▲▼] or number button to select the desired title.

The selected title now starts playing.

Note:

You can select the desired title directly by using number button.

PLAYING A DISC CONTAINING MP3 (or CD) FILES

- When a MP3 disc is loaded, MP3 menu screen is displayed automatically depending on MP3 disc's folder structure.
- Use [◀►▲▼] button to select the folder you want to play, and press the [PLAY] button.



This button allows you to see the file lists under the folder.


- Use [◀▶▲▼] button to select a MP3 file and press the PLAY button then play will start automatically. When you know the file number, enter the MP3 file number using the numeric buttons on the remote control and then press [PLAY] button.
- Press ▶ on the remote control to choose next file. Press I for previous file.

When you know the file number, enter MP3 file number using the numeric buttons on the remote control and then press [PLAY] button.

REPEAT PLAY

When play a disc, this function can be used to repeatedly play a title, chapter, track or disc.

Press "REPEAT" button, the screen shows orderly.



REPEATING A DEFINED PERIOD FROM A TO B

Note:

You may press A-B to enjoy some parts repeatedly when playing a disc.

This function does NOT apply to MP3.

Press "A-B" to set a starting point A.
 Press "A-B" twice to an end point B.
 Afterwards, the unit plays from A to B.

3. Press "A-B" three times to remove A-B repeat.





SELECT A SUBTITLE LANGUAGE

When play a multi-subtitle DVD, you may select one subtitle to show it on the screen.


Note:

- 1. For some discs, subtitles cannot be removed.
- 2. Subtitle function is only available for some discs with subtitle recorders.

Keep pressing [SUBTITLE] button till the user's preferred language appears.



If a DVD disc includes subtitle information, every time the user presses [SUBTITLE] button, ENGLISH, FRENCH, SPANISH and others appear one by one.



Remove the subtitle.

Press SUBTITLE until the screen shows "Off".

SEARCHING

SEARCHING DVD WITH A TITLE/CHAPTER NUMBER OR A TIME

Note:


• SEARCH functionality depends on different DVD disc's format. Some DVD discs do not allow SEARCH function.

 SEARCH does NOT function during Program playback. ■ Using the SEARCH button you may play a disc at a desired Title, Chapter or Time.

Press the [SEARCH] button to select SEARCH mode.

Press ▲ or ▼ button to select title, chapter or time item.

Enter title number, chapter number or time by using numeric buttons directly and then press PLAY to confirm.




SEARCHING CD WITH A DISC /TRACK TIME OR TRACK NUMBER

■ Using the SEARCH button you may play a disc at a desired Track or Time.

Press the [SEARCH] button to select SEARCH mode.

Press ▲ or ▼ button to select track or time item.

Enter track number or time by using numeric buttons directly and then press PLAY to confirm.



Note:

Multi Angle function is limited to a DVD disc supporting multi angle information.

SELECT ANGLE

Some discs have images with different screen angles, you may select among them. For example, when you watch a running train, you may select to watch it from the front, the left window or the right window without stopping it.

Keep pressing [ANGLE] button till the preferred angle appears.

ZOOM PLAY

This function can be used to enjoy a motion or motionless picture.

Press "ZOOM" button when playing, the screen shows orderly:





Press "UP/DOWN/LEFT/RIGHT"[◀►▲▼] button to move the enlarged picture.

BOOK MARK

Note:

If you erase a book mark function, press "RETURN" button. ■ Storing a MARKER in the DVD memory is similar to marking your page in a book. It allows you to quickly return to any point on the disc.





DIGEST PLAY (VCD)

Each time you press INTRO button when the unit is playing a disc, digest playback mode changes as below.

When you select "Intro on", the player will play 10 seconds each track.

PLAYING DivX DISC ON CD-R (W)

- DivX refers to a new format of Audio/Video files available for playback over the internet because of the popularity to download music from DivX websites on to ones computer.
 - When a DivX disc is loaded, the DivX menu screen is displayed automatically depending on DivX disc's folder structure.
 - Move the cursor to DivX file you want to play and press play button.
 - On your disc, if there are many subtitles, press the [SUBTITLE] button for selecting subtitle you want to display.
 - YOUR DVD PLAYER CAN PLAY;
 - Picture DivX version: DivX 3.11, 4.x, 5.x, XviD, ISO-MPEG4, DivX PRO(Excluding QPEL and GMC)
 - Subtitle file extension : It can support Smi, Srt, Sub, TXT.
 - Subtitle Support language: It can display ENGLISH and some languages.
- Note: In order to recognize a DivX subtitle normally, the DivX subtitle language in Language menu should be set to the corresponding national language. (refer to "DivX subtitle" in page 34)

When your order is returned, you receive your prints, negatives, and your full roll of pictures safely stored on you KODAK Picture CD. Each KODAK Picture CD brings you the tools to enhance, share and manage your pictures on your computer.

Now, you can playback Kodak Picture CDs on our DVD players and view your pictures on your TV in the comfort of your living room.

Playing back your Kodak Picture CD

The new feature enables the decoding of JPEG files from a Kodak Picture CD disk.

When a Kodak Picture CD has been loaded in the player, an automatic slide show will be launched.

Each picture in the Kodak Picture CD will be displayed consecutively in a slide-show fashion and will be scaled to fit in the whole TV screen.

Press PAUSE button to display an image indefinitely.

Press SKIP (I← ► I) button to view the next or previous picture.

Press PLAY button to resume the slide show.

Image rotation

Press ANGLE button to rotate a picture.

These operations are allowed only when a picture is being displayed normally and will be cancelled automatically when a new picture is displayed.

Zoom

Press ZOOM button to execute zoom function and select the zoom enlarging scale.

In zoom mode, Press [$\blacktriangleleft \blacktriangleright \blacktriangle \blacktriangledown$] button to move the picture,to adjust the picture to be displayed on the screen. With zoom mode off, the next picture will be scaled to normal fitting to the whole TV screen.


Press PLAY button to cancel the zoom and resuming to the slide show.

■ JPEG file format (limitations)

- JPEG file of CMYK color mode is not supported.
- The range of pixels should be not exceeding 3840 pixels x 3840 pixels, in order to achieve the best performance.

MENU SETTING

Various features of the player can be adjusted in the SETUP menu:




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BASIC NAVIGATION

To navigation through the setting on the screen, use the direction [◀ ▶▲▼] buttons to scroll through the list of settings and use "PLAY" button to select the high lighted function.

SETUP MENU

Press the SETUP button to enter the On Screen Display and to exit at any time. In each of the menus, selecting MAIN PAGE (SETUP menu) will immediately return you to the initial screen.



Language

OSD Language

"OSD" means "On Screen Display". When select a language, the screen show this language.

For example, if you select ENGLISH, the OSD is in English.

■ SUBTITLE

• Selecting Subtitle language.

Please set it as the preferred language. In case the subtitle language is set and recorded in the DISC, it is automatically played in the set language in every playing. For example, English is set and recorded as subtitle language in the DISC, it is played in English.

DivX SUBTITLE

• Selecting DivX Subtitle language.

Please set it as the preferred language. In case the DivX subtitle language is set and recorded in the DISC, it is automatically played in the set language in every playing. For example, English is set and recorded as subtitle language in the DISC, it is played in English.

The default is Western European.

Each DivX subtitle option supports related languages as follows.

- Unicode (UTF-8): supports English, French, Spanish, German, Italian, Dutch and Portuguese. 7 kinds languages for DivX subtitle.
- Western European: supports Albanian, Breton, Catalan, Danish, Dutch, English, Faroese, Finnish, French, Gaelic, German, Icelandic, Irish, Italian, Norwegian, Portuguese, Spanish and Swedish.
- Turkish: supports Albanian, Danish, Dutch, English, Finnish, French, Gaelic, German, Italian, Kurdish (Latin), Norwegian, Portuguese, Spanish, Swedish and Turkish.
- Central European: supports Albanian, Croat, Czech, Dutch, English, German, Hungarian, Irish, Polish, Romanian, Slovak, Slovene and Sorbian.

- Cyrillic: supports Bulgarian, English, Macedonian, Moldavian, Russian, Serbian and Ukrainian.
- Greek: supports English and modern Greek.
- Hebrew: supports English and modern Hebrew.

AUDIO

• Selecting an audio language.

Set it as the preferred audio language. In case the audio language is set and recorded in the DISC, it is automatically played in the set language in every playing. For example, English is set and recorded as audio language in the DISC, it is played in English.

DISC MENU

• Selecting Disc Menu language.

Please set it as the preferred DISC MENU language. In case the DISC MENU language is set and recorded in the DISC, it is automatically played in the set language in every playing. For example, English is set and recorded as a DISC MENU language in the DISC, it is played in English.

Video

■ TV DISPLAY

1 Normal PS

This is selected when the unit is connected with a normal TV. Wide-screen images are shown on the screen, but with some parts cut automatically.



Normal LB

This is selected when the unit is connected with a normal TV. Wide-screen images are shown on screen, with black belts on the top and bottom.



3 16:9 WIDE

This is selected when the unit is connected with a wide-screen TV.



■ TV TYPE

You may select according to the colour system of the TV to be connected.

- Select "NTSC" for a NTSC TV.
- Select "PAL" for a PAL TV.
- Select "Auto" for a multi-system TV.

ANGLE MARK

This only works when there is an angle mark on the disc.

- Select "ON", the screen shows the mark when playing a DVD.
- Select "OFF", the mark is not shown.

CAPTIONS

The hidden subtitle is shown or turn off.

SCREEN SAVER

Start the screen saver, the screen saver image appears when the unit stops or the image is motionless for a few seconds. This saver can keep the screen from being damaged.

HD Resolution

The HD Resolution menu enables you to select the desired HD Resolution used for the video output. There are five Resolution mode. The default is Auto.

HD JPEG MODE

Select HD JPEG mode to On or OFF.

■ DIGITAL Output

• Bitstream

Select this when the DVD player is connected with a power amplifier through optical or coaxial port. Please refer to the page 14. when a Dolby Digital DVD, DTS DVD or MPEG DVD is played, select this, the coaxial or optical port will output in the corresponding digital format (source code). The power amplifier to be connected must have Dolby Digital, DTS and MPEG DVD is played, the optical or coaxial port will output in PCM 2-channel format.

LPCM

Select this when the DVD player is connected with a TV or a power amplifier through audio cord.

OFF

No signal is output from the coaxial, optical port.

Down Mix

Select Down Mix mode to LT/RT or Stereo.

Dual Mono

This is the output mode of the L and R signals of the set audio output. If it is set to "MIX MONO", the function only works when the DVD being played is 2.0-channel.

- STEREO
 Choose this option, the audio output should be dummy stereo signal.
- L-MONO
- R-MONO
- MIX-MONO

Dynamic

Set "Off" to view a program in the dynamic range as recorded in disc. To hear loud sound softer and soft sound louder, set "On". The default is Off.

PARENTAL

■ PARENTAL CONTROL

Note:

The password is 3308 when the unit is turned on initially or you forget the password.

The Parental Control feature allows you to prevent DVDs from being played based on their ratings or to have certain discs played with alternative scenes. You can set the Rating Level from '1. Kid Safe' to '8. Adult'.

The content of a disc with lock function is evaluated by grades. You can select an age grade as your need.

Example: Select "1. Kid Safe", the scenes of violence inadvisable to children are not played.

For adults, the screen suggests you enter the code after pressing "PLAY" button, you can watch if the code is right.

Note:

The password is set by yourself.

SET PASSWORD

Select "SET PASSWORD" in Parental menu to setup password. Press PLAY button, then Enter password screen appears.

OTHERS

TROUBLESHOOTING

If you experience the following problems while using the unit, this troubleshooting guide can help you.

NO SOUND

- Check if the unit is connected securely.
- Make sure you operate the TV or amplifier correctly.

• NO IMAGE, IMAGE ROLLS AND NO COLOUR

- Check if the unit is connected securely.
- Make sure you operate the TV correctly.
- Make sure you set the colour system correctly.

BAD SOUND QUALITY

- Make sure the audio output mode is set correctly.
- Make sure the audio connection between the unit and amplifier is right.

DISC CAN NOT BE PLAYED

- There is no disc in the unit.
- Insert the disc on the disc tray properly with the label side up.
- Clean the disc.
- Moisture has condensed in the unit.

 Remove the disc and leave the unit on for about one hour.

• NO MICROPHONE SOUND

- Switch on the microphone.
- Turn the MIC LEVEL knob clockwise.

MICROPHONE DISTORTION

- Keep the microphone far away from the speaker
- Turn down the volume
- Turn down the volume of microphone.

• REMOTE CONTROL DOES NOT WORK

- Remove barriers between the remote control and the unit.
- Replace the batteries with new ones.
- Point the remote control at the remote control sensor of the unit.
- ATTENTION: KEEPING THE STATUS OF STOP MORE THAN 5 MINUTES ENTERS SCREEN SAVE MODE. WHEN
 THE SCREEN SAVE MODE IS KEPT MORE THAN AN HOUR, THE SET ENTERS STAND-BY MODE.
