Important Safety Precautions


 Cleaning — Unplug the AC cord from the AC outlet before cleaning the product. Use a damp cloth to clean the product. Do not use liquid cleaners or aerosol cleaners.



 Water and moisture — Do not use the product near water, such as bathtub, washbasin, kitchen sink, laundry tub, swimming pool and in a wet basement



 Do not place vases or any other water-filled containers on this product.





 Stand — Do not place the product on an unstable cart, stand, tripod or table. Doing so can cause the product to fall, resulting in serious personal injuries as well as damage to the product. Use only a cart, stand, tripod, bracket or table recommended by the manufacturer or sold with the product. When mounting the product on a wall, be sure to follow the manufacturer's instructions. Use only the mounting hardware recommended by the manufacturer.



 When relocating the product placed on a cart, it must be moved with utmost care. Sudden stops, excessive force and uneven floor surface can cause the product to fall from the cart.

The LCD panel is a very high technology product with 3,147,264 thin film transistors, giving you fine picture details.

Due to the very large number of pixels, occasionally a few non-active pixels may appear on the screen as a fixed point of blue, green or red.

This is within product specifications and does not constitute a fault.

Precautions when transporting the TV

Be sure to always carry the TV by two people holding it with two hands — one hand on each side of the TV.



- Do not display a still picture for a long time, as this could cause an afterimage to remain.
- Install the product on the place where the AC cord can be unplugged easily from the AC outlet, or from the AC INPUT terminal on the rear of the product.


Inserting the batteries

Before using the TV for the first time, insert two "AAA" size batteries (supplied). When the batteries become depleted and the remote control fails to operate, replace the batteries with new "AAA" size batteries.

1 Open the battery cover.



- 2 Insert two supplied "AAA" size batteries.
 - 3 Close the battery cover.



 Place batteries with their terminals corresponding to the (+) and (-) indications in the battery compartment.



(L) CAUTION


Improper use of batteries can result in chemical leakage or explosion. Be sure to follow the instructions below.

- Do not mix batteries of different types. Different types of batteries have different characteristics.
- Do not mix old and new batteries. Mixing old and new batteries can shorten the life of new batteries or cause chemical leakage in old batteries.
- Remove batteries as soon as they have worn out. Chemicals that leak from batteries can cause a rash. If you find any chemical leakage, wipe thoroughly with a cloth.
- The batteries supplied with this product may have a shorter life expectancy due to storage conditions.
- If you will not be using the remote control unit for an extended period of time, remove the batteries from it.

Using the remote control unit


Use the remote control unit by pointing it towards the remote sensor window.

Objects between the remote control unit and sensor window may prevent proper operation.



Cautions regarding remote control unit

- Do not subject the remote control unit to shock.
 In addition, do not soak the remote control unit with liquids, or place it in an area with high humidity.
- Do not install or place the remote control unit under direct sunlight.
 The heat may cause deformation of the unit.
- The remote control unit may not work properly if the remote sensor window
 of the TV is under direct sunlight or strong lighting. In such case, change the
 angle of the lighting or TV, or operate the remote control unit closer to the
 remote sensor window.



Attaching the stand

- Before attaching (or detaching) the stand, unplug the AC cord from the AC INPUT terminal.
- Before performing work spread cushioning over the base area to lay the TV on. This will prevent it from being damaged.

- · Attach the stand in the correct direction.
- . Be sure to follow the instructions. Incorrect installation of the stand may result in the TV falling over.


Confirm the 8 screws supplied with the TV. Short screws (\times 4) (used in step 2)



(1) Set the post for the stand unit onto the 2


2 Attach the base to the post.

(1) Insert the stand into the openings on the bottom of the TV.

(2) Insert and tighten the 4 screws into the 4 holes on the rear of the TV.






- Avoid direct sunlight and place the TV in a well-ventilated location.
- Place the TV in a level location.



• Place the TV close to the AC outlet, and keep the power plug within reach.

2 Bundling the cables

Insert the cable clamp in the hole on the TV as shown.




Basic connection

Connecting to an antenna

To enjoy a clearer picture, use an outdoor antenna. The following is a brief explanation of the types of connections that are used for coaxial cable.



Connecting to the AC outlet



NOTE

- Always turn off the power of the TV when connecting the AC cord.
- Disconnect the AC cord from the AC outlet if the TV will not be used for a long period of time.


Setting the TV on the wall

- You can mount the TV on the wall, using the optional AN-37AG2 bracket.
- For details, refer to the instructions supplied with the optional bracket.

CAUTION

- This TV should be mounted on the wall only with the AN-37AG2 (SHARP) wall mount bracket. The use of other wall
 mount brackets may result in an unstable installation and may cause serious injuries.
- Installing the Liquid Crystal Television requires special skill that should only be performed by qualified service
 personnel. Customers should not attempt to do the work themselves. SHARP bears no responsibility for improper
 mounting or mounting that results in accident or injury.

Removing the stand


For wall mounting with the optional bracket, remove the stand.

Before detaching/attaching the stand

- Before detaching (or attaching) the stand, unplug the AC cord from the AC outlet.
- Remove all terminal covers and connected cables.
- Lay the TV down on cushioning (such as a blanket) over a table.
- Make sure two or more people perform the operation.

CAUTION

. Do not remove the stand from the TV unless using an optional bracket to mount it.







 - TV channel resets to channel 1.
 - Sound volume is initialised.
 - Image position is initialised.

- Still image mode deactivates.
- Teletext mode resets to normal.
- "Audio Only" setting resets to "Off".
- ** Press **SYSTEM RESET** if the TV does not operate after starting up.
- *** Usually do not connect anything to this terminal as it is reserved only for service personnel.

- Pressing **RESET** will not work if the TV is in standby mode (indicator lights red).
- Pressing RESET will not delete channel preset and password. See page 36 for resetting the password. See page 53 for



Watching TV

Turning on the power

Press **POWER** on the TV.

- POWER indicator (Green): The TV is on. (After a few seconds, an image appears with sound.)
- After turning the power "ON" by pressing POWER on the TV, you can turn the power ON/OFF by pressing POWER on the remote control.



Turning off the power

Press **POWER** on the remote control.

- The TV enters standby mode and the image on the screen disappears.
- The POWER indicator on the TV changes from green to red

Press **POWER** on the TV.

- · The POWER indicator on the TV turns off.
- When the TV is turned off by POWER on the TV, you cannot turn on the power by pressing POWER on the remote control.






Simple button operations for changing channels

You can change channels in several ways.

Using CH ∕ / ✓ on the remote control unit

- Press **CH** \(\Lambda\) to increase the channel number.
- Press **CH** to decrease the channel number.




⊘ NOTE

CH \ \ \ \ \ \ \ on the TV operates the same as CH \ \ \ \ \ \ on the remote control unit.



Using 0 - 9 on the remote control unit

Select the channels directly by pressing buttons 0 to 9.



EXAMPLE

To select a 1-digit channel (e.g. channel 2):

• Press 0, followed by 2.

To select a 2-digit channel (e.g. channel 12):

• Press 1, followed by 2.

When viewing Teletext information











Changing the volume

You can change the volume on the TV or on the remote control unit.

- To increase the volume, press VOL+.
- To decrease the volume, press **VOL** .



• "TV", "DTV", "INPUT1", "INPUT2" and "INPUT3" modes can store volume adjustment values separately.

Using Mute ($\mathfrak{l}(x)$) on the remote control unit

mutes the current sound output.



- Mute will be cancelled after 30 minutes. However, the TV will not suddenly output loud sound as the volume level will be set to 0 automatically. Increase the volume level by pressing VOL+.

Press of again within 30 minutes to cancel the mute.

Sleep timer

Allows you to set a time when the TV automatically switches to standby.





Press SLEEP.

Remaining time displays when sleep timer has been set.

Sleep Timer: Remain 2 hr. 00 min.

Each time you press **SLEEP**, the remaining time switches as shown below.



- The sleep timer indicator on the TV lights up when the time has been set.
- When the time has been set, countdown automatically starts.
- Five minutes before the preset of time expires, the remaining time displays each minute.
- Select "Off" by pressing **SLEEP** to cancel the sleep timer.

You can freeze a motion picture on the screen.



When the TV powers on for the first time after purchase, perform the auto installation.

Analogue TV

You can run the auto installation to set channels automatically.

- To watch the analogue TV, select "Auto Installation" from Setup menu. (See page 19.)
- After setting the channels, you can select a channel using $CH \land / \lor$ or 0-9 on the remote control unit. (See page 13.)

DTV

When the TV accesses to DTV mode for the first time. you need to run the auto search. To scan all available services in your area, follow the procedures below.

- To watch DTV broadcasts, select "Auto Search" from Installation menu. (See page 32.)
- After setting the channels, you can select a channel using $CH \wedge / \vee$ or 0-9 on the remote control unit. (See page 13.)

ANALOG: Press to switch to analogue mode. After switching from DTV, radio or external input

mode to analogue mode, the TV jumps to the most recently viewed analogue channel.

DTV: Press to switch to DTV mode. After

switching from analogue, radio or external input mode to DTV mode, the TV jumps to the most recently viewed DTV channel.


RADIO: Press to switch to radio mode. After switching from analogue, DTV or external

input mode to radio mode, the TV jumps to the most recently tuned radio channel.

Use the following buttons on the remote control to operate the menu.



MENU: Press to open or close the menu screen.

▲/▼/◄/▶: Press to select a desired item on the screen or adjust a selected item.


ENTER: Press to go to the next step or complete the setting.

RETURN: Press to return to the previous step.

- 1 Item displayed in yellow
 - This indicates the item currently selected.
 - Press ENTER to go to the adjustment screen for this item.
- (2) Item in brackets
 - This indicates the current setting for the item.
- 3) Item displayed in white
 - This indicates an item can be selected.
- (4) Item displayed in grey
 - This indicates that the item cannot be selected.
 - * There are various reasons why items cannot be selected, but the main reasons are as follows:
 - 1. Nothing is connected to the selected input terminal.
 - 2. The function is not compatible with the current input signal.

⊘ NOTE

- Menu options differ in the selected input modes, but the operating procedures are the same.
- The screens in the operation manual are for explanation purposes (some are enlarged, others cropped) and may vary slightly from the actual screens.

Teletext function

What is Teletext?

Teletext broadcasts pages of information and entertainment to specially equipped television sets. Your TV receives Teletext signals broadcast by a TV network, and decodes them into graphical format for viewing. News, weather reports, sports information, stock exchange prices and programme previews are among the many services available.

Teletext mode

Teletext is turned on/off with (a) on the remote control unit. You can operate your TV in Teletext mode directly by inputting commands with the remote control unit.





Cautions regarding use in high and low temperature environments

- When a programme is set, the TV can be controlled from the PC using the RS-232C terminal. The input signal (PC/video) can be selected, the volume can be adjusted and various other adjustments and settings can be made, enabling automatic programmed playing.
- Attach an RS-232C cable cross-type (commercially available) to the supplied Din/D-sub RS-232C for the connections.




