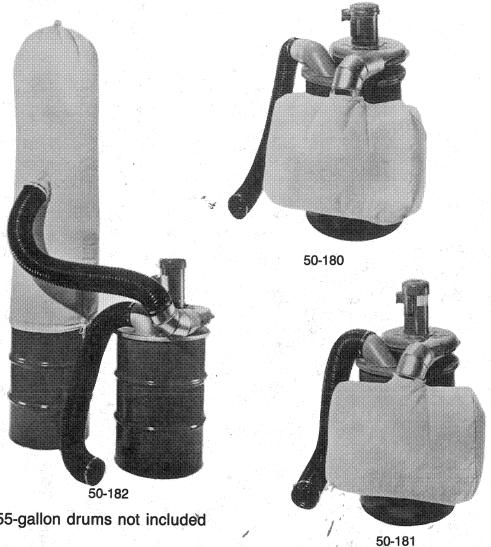

SAFETY RULES

- 1. Follow all local electrical and safety codes, as well as the National Electric Code (NEC) and the Occupational Safety and Health Act (OSHA). All electrical connections and wiring should be performed by qualified personnel only.
- 2. National Fire Protection Association (NFPA) standards require specific duct design and dust collector configuration when collecting potentially reactive metal dusts, such as aluminum and magnesium. Consult current NFPA standards before setting up a dust collector and/or duct design for these two materials.
- 3. Use only 3-wire extension cords which have 3 prong grounding type plugs and are of adequate size for longer runs.
- 4. Replace or repair damaged or worn cord immediately.
- 5. Protect the power cable and never allow the cable to come in contact with sharp objects.

- 6. Do not kink power cable and never allow the cable to come in contact with oil, grease, hot surfaces or chemicals.
- 7. Make certain that the power source conforms to the requirements of your equipment.

8. KEEP AWAY FROM UNIT WHEN IT IS OPERATING.

- a. there is a high speed blower wheel inside the blower housing that can amputate fingers, grab loose clothes or neck ties.
- b. there is also a high speed cooling fan wheel on the top of the motor that should be avoided for the same reasons mentioned in item (a).
- 9. This unit is heavier than the container it sits on and can be turned over if bumped or not placed on a clean, level area.
- 10. Do not attempt to clean or service without disconnecting from power source.

INTRODUCTION

These dust collectors are designed to help maintain clean, safe conditions around dust creating machines in workshops and factories. The flexible hose included with each unit can be hooked directly into the dust creating machine.

Dust collectors work by moving larger volumes of air at lower suction pressures than vacuum cleaners. These units are not designed to be used as high-suction vacuum cleaners.

Components that must be assembled before operation are: sheet metal cylinder, suction hose, two adjustable clamps, sealing gasket, deflector elbow, discharge guard

bag, elbow and the dust bag. See assembly instructions for proper installation.

CAUTION: The blower housing contains a high speed radial blade that can amputate fingers, grab loose clothing and neck ties, or propel dust at high velocities. DO NOT OPERATE WITHOUT THE DISCHARGE GUARD BAG, ELBOW AND DUST BAG IN POSITION.

Do not attempt to clean, remove dust bag, service unit or move a dust collector while in operation. Disconnect from power source first.

UNPACKING

Carton must be in upright position before opening. Inspect for shipping damage and advise carrier immediately if damaged. Check parts list for missing or damaged parts.

ASSEMBLY

- 1. Assembly includes the installation of the sheet metalcylinder, inlet elbows, sealing gasket, discharge gard, bag elbow and dust bag.
- 2. To install the sheet metal cylinder, inlet elbows and sealing gasket, place the unit upside down on a cardboard covered flat area.
- 3. The inlet elbow (A) Fig. 2, is to be attached to the bottom of the lid (B). Remove the nuts and washers from the two studs extending out from the bottom of elbow (C). Position inlet elbow (A), as shown, on the two studs and fasten in place using the two washers and nuts.
- 4. Assemble the sheet metal cylinder (D) Fig. 2, to the bottom of the lid (B) using the three 1/4-20 screws which are installed into nut inserts on bottom of lid.
- 5. Remove the paper protection from the adhesive side of the sealing gasket (E) Fig. 2, and install the gasket (E) to the underside of the lid next to the rim. The unit will be more effective if there are no air leaks between the lid and the drum.

FOR MODELS 50-180 AND 50-181 ONLY

- 6. After placing the unit right side up on the drum, assemble discharge elbow (F) Fig. 2, to the discharge end of the blower. Slip the 6-inch diameter o-ring (G) against the retaining ring on the open end of discharge elbow (F).
- 7. Clamp the open end of dust bag (H) Fig. 2, to elbow sleeve (J), using clamp (K) supplied. **NOTE:** Keep the edge of dust bag fabric 1/4-inch below flange of sleeve (J) to ensure correct locking action of the snap-latches, one of which is shown at (V). With the snap-latches (V) in the raised position, slide the elbow sleeve (J) with the bag attached, over the end of elbow (F) using a slight twisting motion. Snap the latches (V) downward to fasten the bag (H) to the elbow. **NOTE:** Make certain the bag fabric does not interfere with the locking action of the snap-latches.
- 8. On model 50-180 only, attach inlet hose reducer (M) Fig. 2, to inlet elbow (C) and clamp the suction hose (L) to the hose reducer using adjustable clamp (N) supplied.

On model 50-181, no reducer is used; the suction hose is attached directly to the inlet elbow.

FOR MODEL 50-182 ONLY

- 9. After placing the unit right side up on the drum, attach the discharge hose (M) Fig. 3, directly to the blower using clamp (N).
- 10. Attach the other end of discharge hose (M) Fig. 3, to the dust bag (O) using the two clamps (P) and hose sleeve (R).
- 11. Attach inlet hose (S) Fig. 4, to inlet elbow (T) using adjustable clamp (U) supplied.

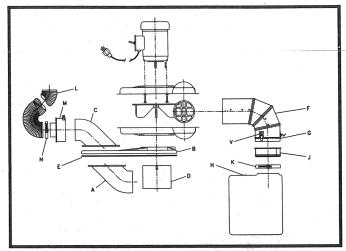

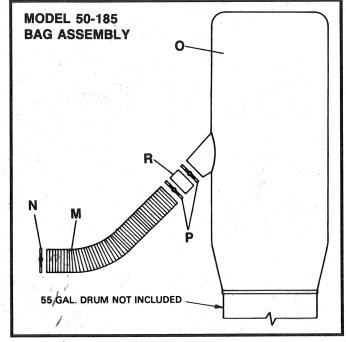

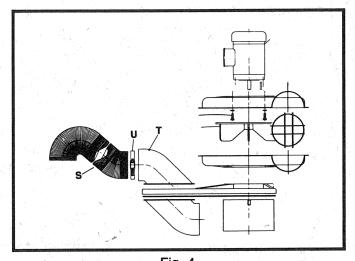

CONNECTING DUST COLLECTOR TO POWER SOURCE

Before connecting your dust collector to an electrical power system, be sure the motor rating agrees with the electrical system it is to be connected to.

SINGLE PHASE OPERATION

If the motor on your dust collector is wired for 115 Volt, single phase, the power cord is equipped with a plug that has two flat, parallel current-carrying prongs, and one longer round or "U" shaped ground prong which requires a mating 3-conductor grounded type receptacle, as shown in Fig. 5.

If the motor on your dust collector is wired for 230, Volt, single phase, the power cord is equipped with a plug that has two flat, current-carrying prongs in tandem, and one round or "U" shaped longer ground prong. This is used only with the proper mating 3-conductor grounding type receptacle, as shown in Fig. 6.

When the three-prong plug on your dust collector is plugged into a grounded 3-conductor receptacle, the long ground prong on the plug contacts first so the machine is properly grounded before electricity reaches it.

CAUTION: IN ALL CASES, MAKE CERTAIN THE RECEPTACLE IN QUESTION IS PROPERLY GROUNDED. IF YOU ARE NOT SURE, HAVE A CERTIFIED ELECTRICIAN CHECK THE RECEPTACLE.

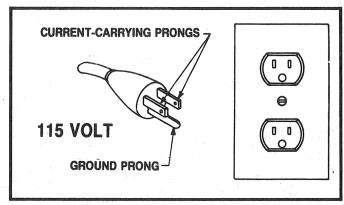
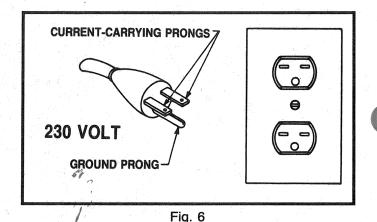

THREE PHASE OPERATION

If your dust collector is equipped with a three phase motor, the necessary wiring from the motor to the power source should be completed by a competent electrician. ELECTRICAL WIRING must be made in accordance with the local and national electrical codes, safety standards and in accordance with the motor nameplate. After connecting to power source, make certain the rotation of the motor is in the proper direction by viewing the rotation of the cooling fan on top of the motor. The cooling fan should rotate clockwise (in the same direction as the outlet of the blower casing). CAUTION: do not insert fingers or any foreign object into the cooling fan cover. Rotation of the motor can be reversed by interchanging any two of the three power lead connections to the motor lead wires.

MAINTENANCE

NOTE: Before any maintenance or service is performed, be sure that unit is disconnected from power source to prevent accidental starting.

CAST ALUMINUM & SHEET METAL FITTINGS:

The cast aluminum blower impeller, as well as all sheet metal fittings are maintenance free and should not require any maintenance during the life of the unit. In a severe dirty operation, the blower impeller should be cleaned with a wire brush to prevent an accumulation of foreign matter that could result in blower unbalance

After cleaning impeller, inspect for possible cracks or excessive wear, which can cause unbalance.

DO NOT USE AN IMPELLER THAT IS CRACKED OR EXCESSIVELY WORN; REPLACE IT WITH A NEW IMPELLER.

MOTOR MAINTENANCE:

Removing dust and dirt: Blow off motor with low pressure air to remove dust or dirt. Air pressure above 50 P.S.I. should not be used as high pressure may damage insulation and blow dirt under loosened tape. The operator performing this cleaning function should always wear eye protective goggles. Dust can cause excessive insulation temperatures.

SAFETY FEATURE

All Dust Collectors have a safety guard at the discharge of the blower housing. This guard is for your safety. Do not remove this guard for any reason. DISCONNECT ALL UNITS FROM POWER SOURCE BEFORE ATTEMPTING ANY MAINTENANCE.

CENTRAL DUST COLLECTION SYSTEMS

The model 50-181 2 H.P. dust collector is widely used to power small central dust collection systems. Model 50-182 may be used if three phase power is available. NOTE: Model 50-180 should not be used for multi-unit central system hook-ups.

The following steps will assist in designing and building a convenient space-saving central collection system.

DESIGN STEPS

(Applicable ONLY to Delta Two Stage Collectors)

1. Determine the **Equivalent** Length for **each** duct run. A "run" is the duct going directly from each tool to the collector; several different runs may use parts of the same branch and main ducts. Equivalent length is determined as follows:

Smooth wall pipe (metal or plastic) - actual length Wire reinforced flexible hose - 150% actual length Direction change equivalent lengths:

- Curved 90° Elbow (include hose bends) = 10 feet (45° = 5 feet)
- Sharp 90° Bend (Tee joint or Elbow) = 20 feet
- Special Y Branch Tee (including required 45° Elbow) = 10 feet

Add together the component equivalent lengths for **each** run to obtain its total equivalent length. (Do not be concerned with the total length of the entire duct system.)

2. Determine Air Flow; (use only 4" or 5" pipe for duct.) The maximum allowable equivalent length of either size duct in each duct run is 100 feet; 120 feet with Model 50-182*. Use the same diameter duct throughout the system.

Air flow at any duct length can be calculated from this table:

Example: 70' Equivalent length, 5'' duct, Model 50-181. CFM = 470 + (2.2 x 30) = 470 + 66 = 536 CFM

*DO NOT EXCEED MAXIMUM DUCT LENGTH IN ANY INDIVIDUAL DUCT RUN AS THIS WILL CAUSE CHIPS TO FALL OUT OF THE AIRSTREAM AND CLOG THE DUCT.

3. DUCT PIPE SELECTION

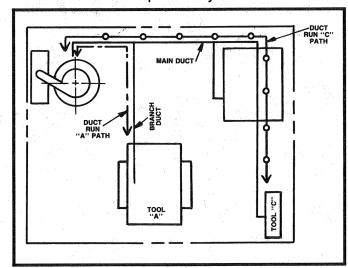
Air flow of 350-550 CFM provides the best dust collection at any woodworking tool. Five inch duct is optimum, and is available in metal furnace pipe. Plastic pipe is easier to install, but is available only in 4" diameter and MUST BE ASSEMBLED WITH AN INTERNAL GROUND WIRE to conduct away potentially explosive static charges. Metal pipe must be sealed with silicone sealant at all joints.

4. TOOL AIR INLET LIMITATIONS

Branch ducts can be attached to one main duct and run to many different tools. However, air must flow at only one tool at a time to ensure adequate dust collection. Additional tool inlets must be plugged or slide gates installed to limit the air flow to only one tool. (Do not use a damper to close off a duct.) There is no limit to the number of branch runs in a system as long as each run does not exceed the maximum length, and air flow is limited to one tool at a time.

Built-in (on tools) dust collection hoods (or other inlets) which have an inlet opening of less than 4", will restrict air flow and cause chips to drop out in the duct. This will not be a problem, however, if another full size inlet in the same duct run is opened periodically to provide a blast of air to flush out the duct. Be sure the second inlet (which may be a full size inlet at another tool) is located farther away from the collector than the undersize inlet.
